This Week's Calendar

Tuesday 4 – St. John Vianney, 1786 – 1859, had to contend with poverty; military service and his own intellectual shortcomings in order to become a priest. From 1830 on, the Cure

averaged twelve to sixteen hours a day in the confessional. He is the patron of priests.
Wednesday 5 – St. Mary Major. It is the first church in the West named in honour of the Mother of God.

Thursday 6 – The Transfiguration – The Cross requires the exodus of Jesus, his death Resurrection and glorification.

Friday 7 - St. Sixtus II, pope, and his four deacon companions were put to death in 258.

Also today we commemorate **St. Cajetan,** who lived in the years 1480 to 1547.

Saturday 8 - St. Dominic, 1170 – 1221, a Spaniard who founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans) to counteract the Albigensian heresy.



It's good to laugh... When God sends help – Don't ask questions!

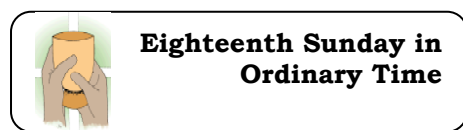

THE AGE OF FIRST COMMUNION

With the present Corona Virus affecting the dates set for First Communions this year, it is interesting to note that on August 8 1910, the question of age for First Communion was addressed as follows: 'The age of discretion required both for confession and communion is the time when the child begins to reason, that is, about the seventh year, more or less. From this time on the obligation of satisfying the precept of both confession and communion begins.

'Both for first confession and first communion a complete and perfect knowledge of Christian doctrine is not necessary. The child will, however, be obliged to gradually learn the whole catechism according to its ability. 'The knowledge of Christian doctrine required in children in order to be properly prepare for first holy communion is that they understand according to their capacity those mysteries of faith which are necessary as a means of salvation, that they be able to distinguish the Eucharist from common material bread, and also approach the sacred table with the devotion becoming their age.'
