## This Week's Calendar

**Mon 6 – St. Maria Goretti**, 1890 -1902, stabbed to death in defence of her virtue.

**St Monnine of Killeavy**, was one of Ireland's early women saints. After instruction on the religious life, she founded a community which initially consisted of eight virgins and a widow with a baby at Sliabh Gullion, Co. Armagh. They lived on a life based on that of Elijah and St. John the Baptist. She died in 517 or 518.

**Tues 7 St. Maelruain**, bishop and abbot, founded a monastery in Tallaght, Co. Dublin in 774 which introduced a reform. Important liturgical and spiritual writings emerged from this movement known as the Céli Dé reform. He died in 792.

**Wed 8 St. Kilian**, was born in the parish of Mullagh in the Diocese of Kilmore. With eleven companions he left Ireland and became known as the apostle of Thuringia and eastern Franconia. He was put to death in 689. There is a very strong devotion to him in Wurzburg, where his remains lie, and also throughout the Bavarian countryside.

**Thurs 9 – Ss Augustine Zhao Rong and Companions** - was born in 1746, converted to Christianity, was ordained and martyred in 1815. The memorial also celebrated 119 companions, martyred in China over several centuries but especially during the Boxer Uprising.

**Sat 11 – St. Benedict**, c 480-547, after living as a hermit at Subiaco, founded the monastery of Monte Cassino. His Rule, observed by Benedictines and Cistercians, is distinguished by its wisdom and balance and those who lived by it did much to shape the Europe of today. Named patron of Europe in 1964.

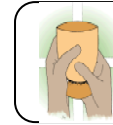

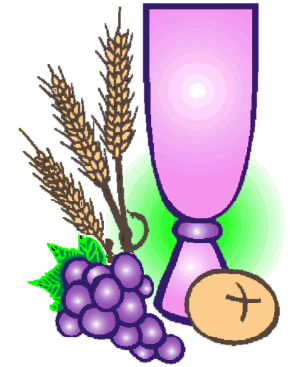
## Our Faith

As concrete manifestations of holiness, our work, actions and ministry are to be rooted in prayer and lead to prayer. Conversely, authentic prayer will motivate, support and arise from our labours.
