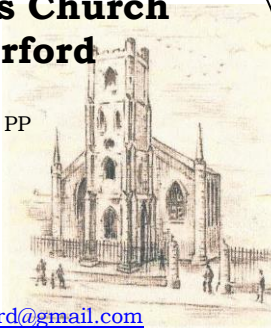

Jesus' Teaching
